## A PIECE ON RACCOONS

Raccoons, or the Procyonidae family, are mammals. Being a part of the Procyonidae family in simple terms means that you have features such as slender bodies and long tails, tree climbing skills, round head & ears, either short or long snouts, and long banded tails. Raccoons are mammals because they are warm blooded, have fur, and can produce milk for their offspring. Their offspring are called kits and are usually born in liters of two to five. Raccoons are omnivorous, meaning they eat nuts, berries, insects, and eggs. Fish and other various small critters are eaten if convenient. Raccoons usually live 2-3 years. The longest ever recorded raccoon lived to be 22 years old. They can weigh from 4 to 23 pounds. The heaviest raccoon, weighed so far, has been a 75-pound raccoon named Bandit. Raccoons are known to have seven species. Although there are three main types of said species, Procyon Pygmaeus, Procyon Cancrivorus, and Procyon Liotor. Procyon Lotor means "before-dog washer" in Neo-Latin. The words Raccoon come from the Powhatan word aroughcun (ahrah-koon-em) meaning "one that scratches with one's hands." Procyon Lotor are the most popular species of raccoon. They are native to northern America and southern Canada and are considered an invasive species.
